Review the list of items that cause you stress. What can you do to counteract them? Write down one solution to reduce each stressor on your list. If anything is beyond your control (like the company's CEO personally or the weather) mark those with an X.

Review the X's:

Although you cannot change the "X" stressors, try writing down something that could be used to help cope with the problem at hand. Understand that these things are out of your control and that they are "not your job to fix."

Return to the List:

Find three things that could be fixed easily; something that can be done in a day or two, and then could be checked off your list. Make a commitment to yourself and the stressor to fix those three items before the end of the next


